



## Winter Road Safety Kit Checklist

Better to be safe than sorry when winter weather strikes. Have a Winter Road Safety Kit in your automobile. The Ohio State Highway Patrol, the Kentucky Division of Emergency Management and NOAA recommend the following:

- Bag of sand or kitty litter for traction
- Blankets / Sleeping bag
- Bottles of water
- Candles
- Cell phone and automobile charger
- Empty tin can to melt snow for drinking water
- Extra clothing to keep dry
- Extra washer fluid
- First-aid kit and any necessary medications
- Flares or roadway detectors
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Help. sign / brightly colored strip of cloth to tie to antenna or hang out of your window
- High-calorie, non-perishable food like granola bars, dried fruit, beef jerky, nuts (if need, be sure to have a can opener)
- Jumper cables



- Lighter/waterproof matches
- Road Maps
- Sharp knife
- Small shovel
- Tissue paper/paper towels
- Tool kit
- Tow rope
- Windshield scrapers and brush
