WAREHOUSING

Over 145,000 people work in the over 7,000 warehouses. Of these people the fatal injury rate for the warehousing industry is much higher than the national average of all industries. The potential hazards for workers in warehousing include:

1. Unsafe use of forklifts
2. Improper sacking of products
3. Failure to use proper PPE
4. Failure to follow proper LOTO procedures
5. Repetitive motion injuries



The top 10 OSHA standards most commonly included in the agency's citations include the following:

- Forklifts
- Hazard communication
- Electrical wiring methods
- Electrical system design
- Guarding floor and wall openings
- Exits
- Mechanical power transmission
- Respiratory protection
- LOTO
- Portable fire extinguishers

Most, if not all, of these citations can be controlled by being proActive with your processes and controls.
